a) PhD in Family Medicine and Primary Care CGPS.15.07PhD_FamMedRev

Professor Gillian Bartlettsquilant Associate Professor and Graduate Program Director for the Department of Family Medicineresented the PhD in Family Medicineresented Primary Care

This program was presented at the last CGPS meeting. In light of the concerns raised at the last meeting about the lack of program requirements, Professor Bartlett pæsærised proposaThe revisions include2 credits of coursespecifically iknowledge translation (3 credits)rticipatory research (3 credits)ree1-credit adanced doctoral seminasad 3 credits of an elective course. Students coming out of the Master's will take 6 credits at the minimum. There are currently 20 students enrolled in the Ad Hoc PhD program. Professor Baxpletsenrollmento increase.

There was a question about the advanced research methods course that is listed as an elective. Cindy Smith Secretary to Subcommittee on Courses and Teaching (SOTTP)ed that this is the right approach because students have a choice of resetance of resetance and will be able to take a course outside the department, so a single course code local listed under the required courses.

b) PhD in Epidemiology – Global Health
