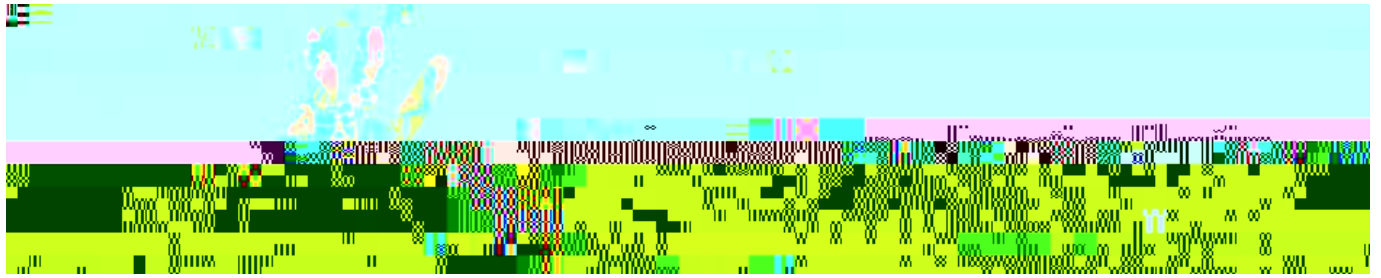
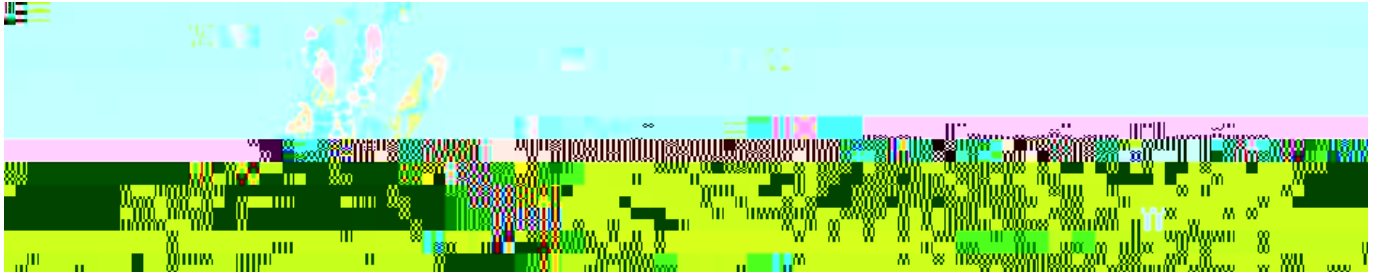


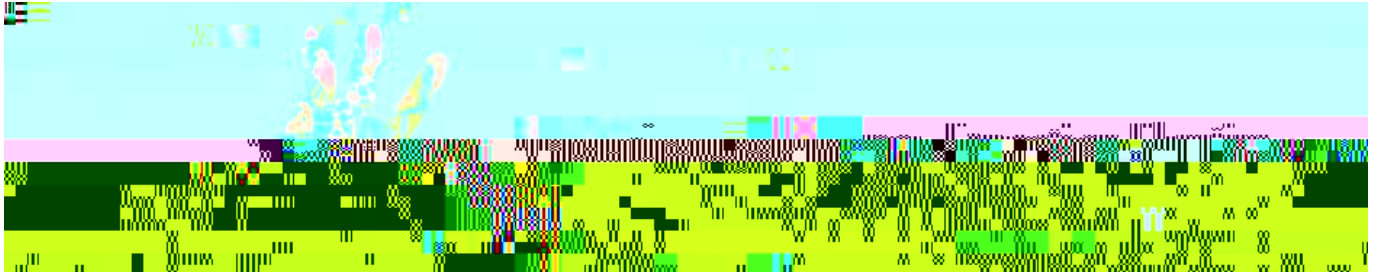

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This elective is ideal for students interested in perfecting their skills in the assessment and management of common cardiology conditions. Trainees will develop an approach to patients with chest pain (cardiac and non-cardiac), heart failure, valvular heart disease and tachy/brady-arrhythmias. Students at Saint Mary's will be provided with ample opportunities to assess patients in the emergency department, medical and surgical wards, as well as in the medical day center and pre-operative assessment center. Students completing this elective will perfect their skills in history-taking, cardiac physical examination, and electrocardiographic interpretation. Trainees are encouraged to observe exercise stress tests and echocardiograms for the patients they have assessed. Students at Saint Mary's review consultations one-on-one with the attending cardiologist.
